Mike became involved with 4-H in 1988. Driven by his desire to see his daughter, Kelly, involved in the 4-H Horse program, Mike determined to become a very active 4-H parent and the club's biggest advocate. He encouraged not only Kelly, but the entire club. He was proud to be their biggest cheerleader!



His greatest contribution has been his continued enthusiasm and committed support of the 4-H program for the last 22 years. Throughout the years, the manner in which he gives his support has changed, but never his desire to "help out in any way possible". When his daughter was involved in 4-H, he was the "go to parent", the one who knew what was going on, attended every meeting and workshop, helped with fund-raisers, quizzed the members on horse bowl questions, helped them prepare for their demonstrations, and drove other members and parents to Lexington for the 4- H State Fair.

During the state 4-H show, he stayed at the Fairgrounds, from beginning to end, supervising, encouraging, and even comforting "his 4-H kids" whatever they needed at the time, always making sure both club members and horses were safely "put up for the night" and ready for their classes the next morning.

Once his daughter graduated high school and went off to college, Mike still wanted to contribute his time to 4-H. It was then (1997) that he started doing the announcing at the area 4-H horse shows and the 4-H state horse shows.

In 1999, Mike was very proud to receive the Mac McQue Volunteer Award from the Jefferson County 4-H Horse Program. Many may remember his response; "I didn't do this to receive an award or attention, I just enjoy the kids and the horses". He always knew the behaviors of the horse that each child exhibited, just as well as he knew the kids' behaviors, and how they would handle each other.

Mike also has a son, Duane, who was in Boy Scouts, and he was just as committed and involved with Boy Scouts as he was with 4-H. While it is true that Mike has offered much time, support, and commitment to 4-H, he considers it one of his most rewarding experiences. He eagerly welcomes each opportunity to be a part of the 4-H program.

Here are a few thoughts from Mike's nominators: "What hasn't Mike done to help and support the 4-H program? He has announced at shows, been gatekeeper, ring steward, delivered the pep talks before a class, got a "poke for good luck", hung our fans, got our shavings, scooped poop at the parades, manned the Crow's Nest...anything and everything that needed to be done Mike was and IS there to help. I can't imagine 4-H without thinking of Mike Butler."

Betty has had a lifelong love of horses. She started training/competing hunters/jumpers, and along the way has also trained/ competed English/Western



Born in North Carolina, Mrs. Herstberger launched her life-long love affair with horses at an early age. She has rid-


