Tresa Skaggs was born into an active 4-H family in Henderson, KY. Tresa grew up riding horses, attending 4-H Horse Camp and competing in everything 4-H had to offer. She loved the friendship and the interaction with both human and horse friends.

After graduating from Henderson County High School, Tresa attended Murray State University and majored in Animal Health Technology where she passed their State Vet Tech Boards. She then attended Georgetown and received a Masters Degree in Special Education. Tresa never missed a beat in college, at age 19 she transitioned from 4-H member to 4-H Volunteer leader and helped to instruct at the West Kentucky 4-H Horsemanship Camp at Murray State University which then combined three areas; Purchase, Pennyrile and Green River. When the areas where combined into districts, she continued instructing in her home camp in Murray State while working to begin a new camp in Sturgis, KY in District 6.

Tresa's parents, Alice & Ralph, liked keeping their three kids in 4-H. "4-H kept them busy, focused on goals and out of trouble," Alice says. "It taught them many valuable lessons. One that Tresa learned early is there is no room for the word can't in her vocabulary! When the going gets tough, just keep trying."

Tresa imparts that wisdom as a Special Education Teacher at Niagra Elementary School in Henderson County, with her 4-H Members in the Horse Club and when she instructs or judges 4-H Horse Shows all across Kentucky and Indiana. Her most recent labor of love is the "Hoof Prints in the Sand, Inc." Therapeutic Riding Program she runs at her own farm in Henderson where special needs youth and adults learn patience, sportsmanship, work ethic and positive attitude. Tresa identifies with these and other 4-H youth who must work just a little harder to achieve their goals.

For 25 years Tresa has been volunteering at the State 4-H Horse Show in Louisville, KY. You can find her before the show begins and late each evening after each show ends, putting together all the trays of ribbons for each class, preparing for the next day where she will serve as a Ring Steward and supervises ribbon youth. She would say that she owes 4-H a lot, but follow her at a judging clinic, horse camp or state show for just one of her many 15 hour days and you will see why the word can't is not in her vocabulary and why it is really 4-H who owes her a debt of gratitude.




