Michael Woods

Woods always believed that getting his children involved in horses not only passed on his love of horses, but also taught them a sense of responsibility and provided them an activity that the whole family could do. He led his two daughters and two foster children in 4-H, and went on to lead a 4-H Horse Club and help countless other children with their 4-H projects. Michael was a firm believer in no child being left out and would often lend his own horses so that the 4-Her would have a horse to ride at the State Show.

Michael was an activist for the 4-H Horse program. He fought to have a 4-H Horse Show added to the Shelby County Fair, and was a consistent figure at all 4-H Horse events, meetings, and shows. Michael was always the first person at the State Show, with his family in tow, to help unload trucks, stuff packets, and set up the office.

Michael was a passionate 4-H leader. He not only attended every 4-H event with his members, but would frequently take his club to horse farms, vet clinics, and horse events around the state. Unless you knew him personally, you would have never guessed that Michael suffered from a debilitating illness. While serving with the 101st Airborne Division during the first Gulf War, Michael was exposed to Sarin Gas. This left him with mobility problems, headaches and an atypical form of Multiple Sclerosis. However, Michael never complained, never slowed down, and continued to live for his family. In May of 2011, Michael was diagnosed with Stage 4 Colon Cancer that had metastasized to his liver. Doctors' believed that this was also caused by his chemical exposure. However, Michael's first concern upon hearing the news of his condition was how his drill team would continue to the state competition.

Even though many adults volunteered to take over coaching the drill team, the youth decided to forego competition that year, out of respect for their coach. The team still attended the drill team competition with Michael to cheer on the other teams. It was at that event that Michael was awarded the 2011 Outstanding Volunteer of the Year Award. He accepted the award while undergoing chemo therapy.

Sadly, after two rounds of chemo, two pulmonary embolisms, and several surgeries, Michael lost his battle with cancer on Veterans Day, one day after his 44th birthday. Michael continued to fight hard until the end, not for himself, but for his family who continues to entrench themselves in the 4-H horse program. His wife Jessica serves on the executive committee for the 4-H Horse Advisory Council, and daughter Danielle has served as a district representative. He is survived by Jessica, his wife of 18 years, two daughters Danielle and Megan (both 4-H members), and son Christopher who was always by his side, his loving mother, two sisters, one brother, several nieces and nephews, and a large 4-H family whose lives he touched. Michael's impact on the 4-H horse program will not be forgotten.


