Harold Wayne Hopkins was a very active 4-H parent and volunteer from Livingston County. He grew up in Ledbetter, KY riding, training, and competing in Western Pleasure Competitions. He was a remarkable individual, with a strong opinion about horses, children, and 4-H. He believed wholeheartedly in the 4-H Programs, and their ability to develop children's minds through the programs and animal involvement.

Mr. Hopkins gave youth the opportunity to be involved with the 4-H Horse Project. He would not only provide his own horses and transportation, but he would also mentor and encourage the youth throughout their participation in 4-H.

Mr. Hopkins was a pillar in the equine community in Livingston County 4-H, the Western Kentucky region, as well as at the State Program for four decades. He was an active supporter of the Livingston County Fair Equine Board Association and the Kentucky 4-H Program. Through the years he has mentored and influenced hundreds of 4-H youth and adults.

Unfortunately, Mr. Hopkins passed away in September 2013. He leaves behind his wife of 52 years, Patricia Hopkins and three children, Paula Jerrell 4-H agent in Ballard County, Pam Salazar, Tim Hopkins, as well as eight grandchildren. His family looks back over the years and remembers their father and mother as community minded, dedicated individuals. Always willing to lend a helping hand.

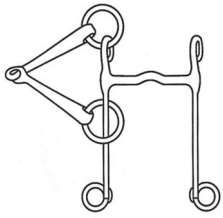

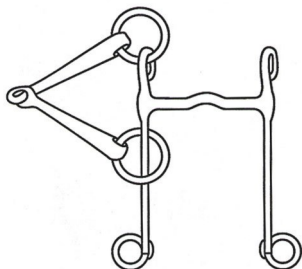

Through the drill association, she is also a teacher for incoming and renewing judges, as well as conducting clinics with riders and their teams. Her judge experience includes local, regional, and national events such as the Grand Nationals at the Cow Palace in San Francisco, California; South East Mounted Drill team Association in Georgia; Oklahoma Equestrian Drill team Association, Oklahoma State Fair, USEDA Regionals, Texas State 4-H Horse Show, and the U.S. Nationals in Lindale, Texas.
